About our 2010 workshops and artists...

Painting: Ellen Zelano

Session 1) arrive May 30 — depart June 12

Ellen's program offers a variety of fine arts experiences from painting still life, figure and landscape, to sculpting from the live model. Students are encouraged to take advantage of the opportunity to paint, draw and sculpt full time and to be adventuresome by trying new mediums. Critique and demonstration is readily available when needed, and instruction is appropriate to student's level of experience. Sculpting materials are provided at Montorno.

Ellen Zelano is a professional artist, and an adjunct professor at the Corcoran College of Art and Design, where she teaches painting and portraiture. She maintains a studio in Washington, DC, specializing in portraiture and still life. Her technical approach is classical and reflects her admiration of great historical artists such as Velasquez, Vermeer, Caravaggio, Manzù and other contemporary artists. Her study of classical art, ancient and renaissance, provides direction and inspiration in her work. Her personal history, imagination and aesthetics come together on canvas to create a distinctive and articulate painting style inspired by the classics. Her work has been in many juried and invitational exhibitions around the metropolitan D.C. area, New York City and New England, and is in many collections around the country, and in Europe. Currently, her work is in the La Petite Gallery in Annapolis, MD, and the Berkley Gallery in Warrenton, VA.

Painting & Bas-relief: Danni Dawson & Mike Francis

Session 2) arrive June 20 — depart July 3

Danni and Mike's workshops provide students with a wealth of painting and sculpture opportunities. Danni's sessions will feature painting and sculpting directly from the model, using both grisaille and color studies. Mike will focus on landscape painting in the village and on the mountain-side (at Montorno). Students may work in oils, acrylics, watercolors or pastels, and will receive daily critiques.

Danni Dawson received her B.A. and M.F.A. degrees from George Washington University and apprenticed with Nelson Shanks. A professional artist and teacher for over 25 years, Danni has exhibited her paintings nationally and internationally, and has received many awards including the Allied Artist Award, the Salmagundi Painting Prize, The Audubon Award and an Award for Painting from The National Academy of Art and Design. Her work has also been featured in *American Artist*, most recently in the Winter 2007 *American Artist Workshop* magazine article "Danni Dawson: Helping Still Life Painters Find An Individual Voice." With over 300 portraits to her credit, Danni Dawson has painted heads of state, dignitaries, and university officials as well as senior members of the military and medical communities. Her portraits and still life paintings are displayed in collections throughout the world.

Mike Francis studied at the Corcoran School of Art, received his BFA from the Maryland Institute College of Art, and his MFA from George Washington University. Teaching experience includes the Art League School (1978 to present), George Washington University (20 years), George Mason University, Trinity College, Northern Virginia Community College, Prince George's Community College, and Charles County Community College. In addition, he has taught abroad through the auspices of various institutions in Paris, Brittany, Spain, Greece, Italy, and Ireland. Mike has had twenty solo exhibitions in the last twenty-six years, and participated in hundreds of group efforts. Many of these events were reviewed in various media. He has received several awards, including the Virginia Prize for Painting and the David Lloyd Kresge Award.

Contemporary Painting & Drawing: Judy Southerland & Geneveva Fernandez

Session 3) arrive Aug 1 — depart Aug 14

This year our focus will be on strengthening a personal approach to painting and drawing through careful consideration and experimentation with materials. Using oils, acrylics, water media or drawing media, plus everyday "found stuff," including tools, students develop and refine art-making skills and expand their representational or abstract vocabularies through focused sessions exploring themes in Italian art that can influence a student's approach to making images. This year, to expand ideas about painting, we will study the Arte Povera movement, keep a modest visual journal of everyday rituals or happenings plus notes on materials and we will begin each session with a small sculpture or a drawing using tossed out or found materials. We will focus on the use of wash and liquidity in paint to establish compelling atmosphere and background and revisit principles and ideas about the use of color in our work. Because some of this will involve notions of "painting outside painting" we will consider presentation and context. Painters at all levels are welcome. We have a model available, and demonstrations and critique will be an integral part of the class.

Judy Southerland is an artist and adjunct faculty at the Corcoran College of Art & Design where she teaches Painting in a Series, Figure & Content and Graduate Cross-Media Studio. Solo exhibitions include Borderland, Jan 8-Feb 22, 2010 at Greater Reston Arts Center, Reston, VA, Close to far Away, Miami University, Middletown, OH, 2008; and In/Out of Place, The Arts Club of Washington, Washington, DC, 2007. Group shows in 2009 include Strictly Painting 7, McLean Project for the Arts, McLean, VA, Crossing Lines, Delaware Center for Contemporary Art, Wilmington, DE and 20th National Drawing & Print Exhibition, College of Notre Dame, Baltimore, MD. Judy received faculty development awards to support new work in 2007 & 2009 and in a Small Projects Grant from the DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities in 2007.

Geneveva Fernandez is an artist and co-founder of the Art Studio in Moscow, Russia, where she taught painting and drawing. She has since moved to Madrid, Spain, and has established the Art Studio there. Her paintings were featured in a group exhibition in Moscow, January 2009. In 2008 her work was in a group exhibition at the Art Play Center for Design and Architecture in Moscow. Also in 2008 a solo exhibition of her paintings was on view at Gala Hispanic Theater in Washington, DC. Geneveva has a graduate degree in the history of art from Madrid's Universidad Autonoma and studied painting for an academic year at the Institute of Fine Arts Surikov in Moscow. Geneveva received a Faculty Award for Excellence from the Corcoran College of Art and Design in Washington, DC, where she studied painting 2005-2007.

Painting: Kurt Schwarz

Session 4) arrive Aug 19 — depart Sept 1

Explore the vital aspects of painting from the model, landscape, and still life—in oil, acrylic, and pastel. Focus on composition, color harmony, value relationships, space, and texture. Kurt will demonstrate the use of special techniques to achieve stunning realism.

Kurt Schwarz is a realist painter specializing in portraiture, still life, and landscape. The exploration of color harmony and spatial concepts are equally important in Schwarz's creations. His skill in capturing the complex nature of his subjects has contributed to his reputation of being one of Loudoun County's finest artists. Kurt Schwarz's career highlights include six solo exhibitions and publication in fine art magazines, including the international publication *The American Artist*. Schwarz has professed at The George Washington University, and is current faculty to both the Art League School in Alexandria, VA, and the Loudoun Academy of the Arts in Leesburg, VA. Schwarz's work is in collections worldwide—in Europe, Mexico, and across the United States. His posthumous portraits of notable figures in Loudoun County's history may be viewed in the permanent public collection of the Balch Public Library in Leesburg, VA. Under the authority of the United States government in 1999, Schwarz traveled to Havana, Cuba, as an International Artistic Advisor. There, he accompanied the Executive Director of Cross Cultural Services (CCS) to advance U.S. Cultural exchanges and advancement in the arts with the nation of Cuba. Schwarz is a member of The Loudoun Arts Council, which promotes the arts in Loudoun County by advocating for and assisting arts organizations and individual artists. He has been accepting commissions since 1992, and currently resides in Loudoun County with his wife who is a fellow artist. ■
